(Using Andover Fabric's Chateau Chambray prints, designed by Renee Nanneman)



Finished quilt: 18" x 18" Finished block: 4" x 4"

#### **Materials**

Assorted prints from the Andover Chateau Chambray collection (designed by Renee Nanneman) in pink, blue,

tan and cream (one charm pack)

Plus, these additional prints from the collection:

- 1/8 yard of medium blue print for half-square triangle units
- 1/4 yard of cream print for half-square triangle units and outer border
- 1/8 yard of light blue floral print for inner border
- 1/4 yard of pink fabric for binding
- 5/8 yard of fabric for backing
- 24" x 24" piece of thin cotton batting

# Cutting

From the assorted prints, cut

76 squares, **1 1/2" x 1 1/2"** (making sure to include at least 22 squares cut from the pink prints) From the medium blue print, cut

4 squares, 2 7/8" x 2 7/8"

From the cream print, cut

4 squares, 2 7/8" x 2 7/8"

2 strips, **3 1/4" x 12 1/2**"

2 strips, **3 1/4" x 18 1/2"** 

From the light blue floral print, cut

2 strips, **1** 1/2" x 8 1/2"

2 strips, **1 1/2" x 10 1/2"** 

From the pink binding fabric, cut

3 strips 1 1/4" x 42"

#### Make the Block

1. Sew 8 pink (1 1/2") print squares and 8 pink and tan (1 1/2") print squares together into 4 fourpatch units, as shown.



2. Layer each 2 7/8" medium blue print square with a 2 7/8" cream print square, right sides together, with the lighter square on top. Draw a diagonal line across each light square. Stitch 1/4" away from the line on both sides. Cut along the drawn line. Press seams toward the blue fabric.




Make 8.


3. From the assorted 1 1/2" squares, choose 6 from a light print, 6 from 2 different pink prints and 4 squares from 2 different blue prints. Sew these into 4 four-patch units as shown.



4. Sew 2 half-square triangle units and 2 four-patch units together to form a block, as shown.



5. Make 4 blocks total and sew them together as shown, with the blue triangles forming star points, to make the center of the quilt top.



### Make the Quilt

1. Sew the two  $1 \frac{1}{2} \times 8 \frac{1}{2}$  light blue floral inner border strips to the sides of the quilt. Sew the two  $1 \frac{1}{2} \times 10 \frac{1}{2}$  blue inner border strips to the top and bottom of quilt. Press.




2. Sew 10 of the assorted print squares  $(1 \frac{1}{2} \times 1 \frac{1}{2})$  into a row. Make 2 rows.




Make 2 rows.


Sew one row to each side of the quilt top.



3. Sew 12 of the assorted print squares  $(1 \ 1/2" \times 1 \ 1/2")$  into a row. Make 2 rows. Sew one row to the top and one row to the bottom of the quilt top. Press.



4. Sew the two  $3 \frac{1}{4} \times 12 \frac{1}{2}$  cream print outer border strips to the sides of quilt. Sew the two  $3 \frac{1}{4} \times 18 \frac{1}{2}$  cream print outer border strips to the top and bottom of quilt. Press.



## Finish the Quilt

1. Layer the quilt top, batting and backing fabric. Baste or pin the layers together.

2. Quilt as you wish. I quilted 2 squares in the center of the quilt and in the ditch around the center parts. I outlined the star points, stitched Xs in the corner four-patch blocks, and stitched through the middle of the blue inner border. Then I used a stencil to mark a floral design and quilted that along the outer borders.

3. Bind the quilt using your favorite binding method. I like to use a single fold binding strip (1 1/4") for less bulk.

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
